STEP 1: APPLICATION AND PROPOSED SCOPE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete Skills Active Assessor Application Form • Two referees: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Workplace or industry representative ○ IEA Aquatics endorsement
STEP 2: SELECTION	<p>CV/ Portfolio with evidence to meet the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hold NZC in Aquatics (Level 4)-Specialised Swim and Water Safety Teacher and in the same discipline(s) that they will be assessing • Hold current First Aid Certificate • 500 logged hours of swim teaching and/or training swim instructors. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ These hours should be within the last 3 years (but no longer than four years) ○ Logged hours will include proof of teaching in the same discipline(s) that they will be assessing. • A minimum of two years experience as a Skills Active assessor
STEP 3: TRAINING AND ASSESSMENT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete Skills Active Assessor Workshop and Assessment - Gaining NZQA Unit Standard 30421 <p>OR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Equivalent Knowledge and Skills, and attendance at a Skills Active Assessor Induction session
STEP 4: REGISTRATION AND CONFIRMATION OF SCOPE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • First assessments completed under the direction of an approved Senior Assessor Mentor (SAM) • Registration and scope confirmed
STEP 5: MODERATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Engage in Skills Active Moderation annually
STEP 6: MENTORING AND CURRENCY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ongoing contact with Skills Active Learning Support Advisor (LSA) • Complete Skills Active annual Moderation and Refresher Training • Evidence of ongoing professional development • Swim teacher re-registration process through NZRRP every three years • Assessor re-registration process every three years
